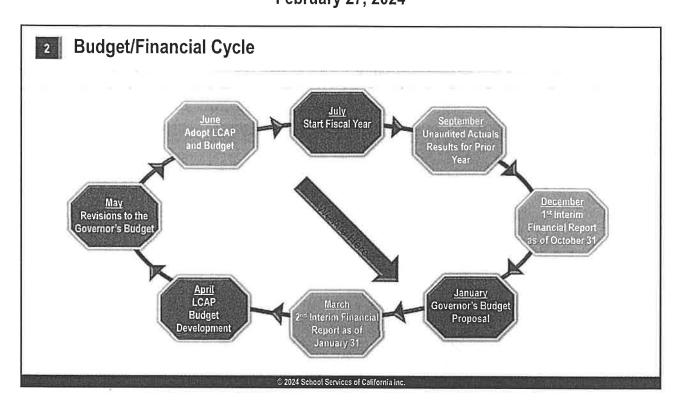

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Fluctuating Statutory COLAs From the DOF

- The changing statutory COLA is NOT related to the state's financial health
 - Rather, the statutory COLA is computed using federally aggregated metrics
- The statutory COLA is a calculated percentage, but Governor Gavin Newsom and the Legislature must still determine whether there is sufficient money to fund the statutory COLA
- The significant projected decline in 2024-25 is the result of two primary factors:
 - Reversal in price increases that occurred in 2022
 - Revisions to historical data points

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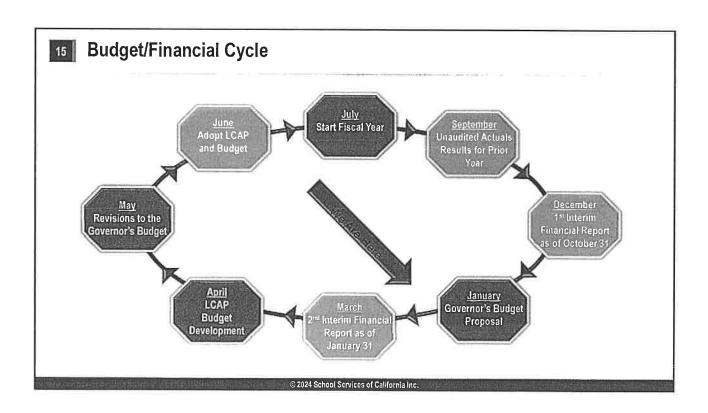


LAO* to Legislature: Deteriorating Budget Condition Ahead

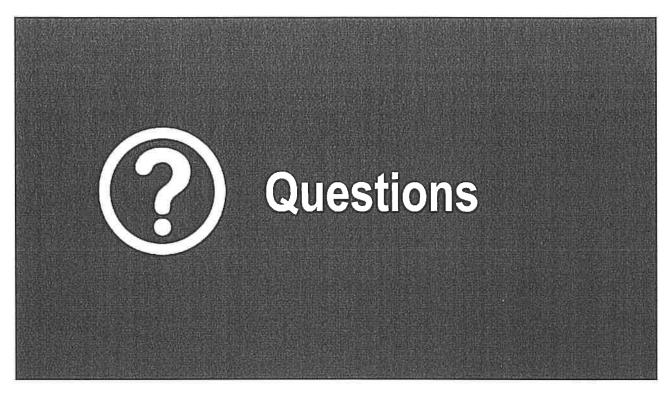
- Estimated \$58 billion State Budget deficit (for comparison, during the height of the COVID-19 recession, the 2020-21 Enacted Budget addressed a \$54 billion deficit)
- Providing no COLA for 2024-25
- Rejecting most of the Governor's new spending proposals
- · Reducing spending in existing programs through policy adjustments
- Sweeping some unallocated education funds
